How to Earn, Redeem & Maximize Your Virgin Points

1. Introduction to Virgin Atlantic Flying Club

Virgin Atlantic's Flying Club is the airline's frequent flyer program, now part of the **SkyTeam Alliance**, giving members access to a broader global network of flights and benefits.



However, the Virgin ecosystem can be confusing.

The Flying Club handles flight rewards, while **Virgin Red** manages lifestyle and brand-wide rewards (Virgin Hotels, Virgin Voyages, etc.). Both use **Virgin Points** and can be linked to combine balances.

- Always link your Flying Club and Virgin Red accounts to maximize earning and redemption flexibility.

2. Membership Tiers & Status Benefits

Flying Club has three simple tiers:

- **Red**: Base tier, earn points and access standard rewards.
- **Silver** (SkyTeam Elite): 400 Tier Points/year, 30% bonus points, Premium check-in, and extra baggage.
- **Gold** (SkyTeam Elite Plus): 1,000 Tier Points/year, 60% bonus points, lounge access, Upper Class check-in, companion vouchers, and birthday bonus points.

Even reward flights earn Tier Points — a rarity among frequent flyer programs.

3. Earning Virgin Points

There are multiple ways to earn Virgin Points:

- **Flights:** Earn by fare class and distance on Virgin and partner airlines.
- **Credit Cards:** Virgin Atlantic Reward & Reward+ Mastercard in the UK, plus US equivalents. Virgin routinely offers generous welcome bonus of 15,000+ miles for signing up to their premium card. Read more about why such [offers are worth taking up](#)
- **Hotels & Cars:** Partner earn rates with Hilton, IHG, and car rental firms.
- **Virgin Holidays:** Earn 20 Tier Points per £500 spent (max 400 per booking).
- **Transfers:** Convert Amex Membership Rewards, Marriott Bonvoy, Hilton Honors, or IHG Rewards into Virgin Points.
- **Virgin Red:** Earn on everyday spending and experiences.

4. SkyTeam Alliance Benefits & Partners

Virgin's SkyTeam membership means elite benefits like **priority boarding, extra baggage, and lounge access** apply across all 19 SkyTeam airlines.

Major partners include Delta, Air France-KLM, Korean Air, and Aeromexico, while Virgin also maintains strong non-SkyTeam partnerships with ANA, Singapore Airlines, Air New Zealand, WestJet, and others.

Not all partners earn the same. For instance, Air France La Première earns 200 Tier Points but 500% Virgin Points — reflecting Virgin's unique earning structure.

5. Virgin Atlantic's Move to Dynamic Pricing

On October 2024, Virgin Atlantic fully transitioned to a dynamic pricing model for reward seats, aligning with Delta and other SkyTeam airlines.

While marketed as an “enhancement,” it represents a major shift that travelers should understand before redeeming.

What Changed:

- Virgin scrapped its fixed award chart, replacing it with variable pricing.
- Introduced “Saver” awards, which can occasionally match or undercut old fixed rates.
- Upper Class Saver fares can start as low as 23,000 points one-way to the U.S. East Coast.
- But standard **awards can soar to 350,000+ points one-way** in Upper Class during

high demand.

Reward Seat Availability Tool:

Virgin now offers a **Reward Flight Finder** where users can browse monthly availability across routes.

For a free tool it is helpful, it requires separate searches for outbound and inbound legs.

Winners and Losers:

- Winners: Flexible solo travelers who can book off-peak or last-minute deals.
- Losers: Families, couples, and those needing specific travel dates — saver awards have become scarce, especially on routes like the Caribbean.

Saver vs. Dynamic Pricing in Practice:

A return Upper Class flight to Boston might still appear at 67,500 miles — a good deal under the Saver level. Yet, many other routes show pricing well above previous “standard” rates, sometimes 4–5× higher.

6. Best Virgin Points Redemptions

Despite dynamic pricing changes, there remain excellent sweet spots for strategic flyers:

1. Virgin Upper Class – 23K–29K one-way to Boston/New York/Delhi.
2. Virgin Premium Economy – from 10.5K miles.
3. Air France-KLM Business – 48.5K between Europe and the Caribbean/US East Coast.
4. Delta One Suites – 50K from US–Europe (ex-UK) + ~\$5 in fees.
5. ANA Business Class – 60K from Europe–Japan.
6. ANA Business – 52.5K from Japan–Australia.
7. Air New Zealand – 20K from NZ–Pacific Islands.
8. Delta Domestic First – 7.5K within the US.
9. Kenya Airways Business – 35K within Africa.
10. Virgin Voyages Cruises – 120K+ via Virgin Red.

□ Even with dynamic pricing, Virgin occasionally releases Saver fares that rival pre-devaluation values — watch SeatSpy for alerts.

7. How to Book Virgin Atlantic Reward Flights


Booking Virgin awards now takes some finesse:

Step 1: Virgin's Reward Flight Finder

Use the Reward Flight Finder to check monthly availability. It's ideal for spotting Saver seats and comparing cabin classes.

Step 2: Use SeatSpy

If step 1 does not prove successful straight away, you can go back and check routinely or use a paid tool such as [SeatSpy](#), this tracks real-time Virgin award space and displays availability calendars and heatmaps.



Filter by route, cabin, or maximum miles. The convenience of this tool is you can set up alerts to automatically notify you when seats become available for your date/date range.

Step 3: Book Direct on Virgin Atlantic website

All bookings must be made through [VirginAtlantic.com](#) or by phone for partner flights (ANA, Air New Zealand).

□ Virgin's website can be temperamental — if an airport doesn't appear, try typing the code (e.g., "JFK" or "LHR").

8. Booking Tips & Common Frustrations

Dynamic pricing has increased unpredictability — check often and be flexible.

Taxes/surcharges for Upper Class can top £650+ per direction.

Website bugs: airport search failures, repeated logins, and missing destinations.

If you can't complete a booking online, call Virgin Atlantic Flying Club — phone agents can access partner space not visible on the site.

9. Final Thoughts & Quick Reference Summary

Virgin's shift to dynamic pricing marked a turning point for the Flying Club. While it added flexibility, it also diluted transparency and predictability. Yet, the program remains valuable for those who plan strategically.
